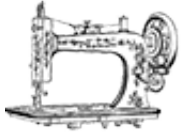

What You'll Need for Class

- Sewing Machine (including any tools that come with your machine)
- Sewing Machine Manual (if you do not have a printed-out copy, please be prepared to bring a downloaded version)
- Thread
- Bobbins for your Machine (note: always check the package of bobbins when purchasing to ensure that your sewing machine model appears for usage)

- Sewing Machine Toolbox – (Note: all can are available at The Sewing Station Learning Center Online Boutique or NWSC):
- Hand Stitch Needles
- Scissors for cutting fabric
- Snippers for cutting threads
- Seam ripper
- Tape measure and/or ruler
- Straight Pins (25)

- Button Hole & Button Pressor Feet
- Machine Needles per your machine; both single & double needles (note: always check the package of needles when purchasing to ensure that your sewing machine model appears for usage)

Fabrics –

- For Part 1: Any scrap fabric will do for stitching out our samples
- For Part 2: two different types of Fat Quarters Fabric
